This new play area was funded through Section 106 contributions from the new Gleeson Homes development on Station Road at Langwith Junction.

Over the summer local children have really enjoyed the new play equipment and their families were also extremely pleased when Langwith Parish Council installed some new picnic and seating benches for the adults to enjoy a spot of fresh air whilst keeping a watchful eye on their youngsters.

Fortunately, it was quickly spotted by Parish Caretaker Simon, that one of the screws had been removed from a swing, and he was able to ensure it was fixed before a child could have ended up falling from the swing and sustaining an injury!

Keeping our youngsters entertained in Langwith

Langwith Parish Council continues to work together with Rhubarb Farm

Langwith Parish Council and Rhubarb Farm have been working together on projects to support the local community.

Rhu-Baby is a lovely community shop intended to help families with all the necessary equipment and clothing etc which is needed for babies and toddlers.

The goods are all in super condition and are available for just a small affordable donation.

Rhu-Baby is open from 9am until 12noon on Friday mornings and is located in the old caretaker house at the end of the village hall at Whaley Thorns. The Langwith Food Hub,

which is run jointly by Rhubarb Farm and Langwith Parish Council, continues to be popular with local residents.

The Food Hub is open to all and operates much like a market stall. Anyone who attends pays a flat rate of £4 for a carrier bag full of food which they select from the items on offer. The produce available varies from week to week but includes lovely seasonal vegetables and fruit as well as other store cupboard items.

As we approach the winter months the timings of the food hub have slightly changed, with the sale of food commencing at 9.30am and finishing at 10am although anyone attending the food hub is also welcome to stay on for a cuppa and a natter.

The show included trade stalls from local small businesses selling all sorts from homemade crafts, woodwork, baby products and natural dog treats. There were also service stalls offering information and support on a multitude of subjects from gambling, suicide awareness, and blood pressure and health checks!

The activities on offer were for the whole family and included amongst others the hugely popular Alpaca walking, inflatables, and fair rides.

Shirebrook Miners Welfare Brass Band (pictured above) also provided some popular musical entertainment on the village green.



Visitors were also wowed with entertainment which included Belly Dancing and a Viking encampment battle in the show ring!

Café mural - Rhubarb Farm were thrilled to gain the expertise of Gabby, a University Art Student, who lead a team of volunteers and support staff in creating some wonderful murals on the walls of the Rhubarb Farm Café (pictured below).

The Café is at the heart of Rhubarb Farm and the outside is visible to all who take a seat on the village green area either daily eating their lunch, or at one of the many events which take place at the farm.

The artwork, drawn up by Gabby, portrays the staff, volunteers, animals and produce of the farm and everyone involved enjoyed the process and agrees that it has created a vibrant piece which now brilliantly brightens up the village green area.

Rhubarb Farm Shop is now open on Fridays from 10am until 3pm, and on Saturdays from 10am until 1pm.

On Saturdays people are welcome to walk around the farm and see the animals as well as popping in to enjoy a piece of homemade cake from the café.

The Farm Shop sells seasonal fresh produce grown at the farm as well as other locally sourced staple produce. You will also find honey from the farm's bees, eggs from their hens, homemade pies, pickles, and jams and lots more besides.

Litter Picking Heroes



The Langwith and Shirebrook Litter Heroes are a friendly group of locals who have had enough of seeing other people's litter blighting the area's beautiful landscape and posing a threat to wildlife and instead of moaning chose to take some positive action!

The group was established four years ago with equipment initially supplied by us and a bin funded by Derbyshire Parks, the group has collected and removed tonnes of cans, crisp packets, bottles, and sweet wrappers from the village's streets, parks, and green spaces. Of course it would be better if nobody ever dropped litter, threw litter out of car windows, or failed to clear up after themselves after a party in a car park.

But, until that day, from places that need to be cleared regularly like Pit Hill, Main Street, and Poulter Park car parks, to spots which once cleared seem to stay quite clean such as the back path between Langwith and Langwith Junction, the Litter Heroes will keep trying to make a positive difference!

If you feel willing and able to do something about litter too, then you would be welcome to join the Litter Heroes.



They have a regular meet up on the 3rd Saturday of the month from 9am at Whaley Thorns / Langwith train station car park. People can pick by themselves or in small groups and children are welcome too. Members return to the car park around 11am to drop off the rubbish and hand in any borrowed equipment such as bags, hoops, pickers and high viz vests.
